The Camp's February Meeting was held on Tuesday, Feb 5th. The first item on the agenda was Camp Commander Jerry Walden administering the SCV Oath to new member John Bradford. Welcome to our Camp, John! We're proud to have you.

This month's guest speaker was David Moore, producer of the film "Black October 1862". The movie revolves around a chain of events that occurred in North Texas during 1862 which saw a secret band of Union sympathizers plot to band together and attack the Confederate armories protecting the north Texas region located in Gainesville and Sherman. After securing weapons and materials they planned to attack those in the area who were loyal to the Confederacy, killing as many men, women and children as possible and then securing the vacated properties for themselves. The plot was soon discovered and members of the Union League were brought to justice before they could enact their treacherous plan.

David gave us a very insightful view of what went on during the filming of "Black October 1862" and discussed some of the chal-

lenges they faced behind the scenes. Following David's narrative, we were treated to a screening of the movie for our Camp. (Note: This movie runs about an hour in length and copies are available for a donation to help cover the costs of production.)

David also outlined their new project which is a film depicting the little known Lee, Peacock Feud that also occurred in north Texas., shortly after the war.

It is a true story of hardships endured by Texas families at the hands of an occupying Federal Army and the carpetbaggers and

other scum intent on stealing their farms and in general punishing them for being loyal to the Confederacy. This is a true story of Captain Bob Lee's return home and attacks on him and other southern citizens which resulted in a feud leading to the deaths of over 200 people from 1866 to 1871. David also appealed to our Camp membership to help support the filming of this new movie, which will start filming very shortly. Following the showing of the movie, Floyd Cox shared with us copies of a poster he had made with General Robert E. Lee's General Order # 73 that Lee issued to troops in his command just prior to crossing over into Pennsylvania on his way toward Gettysburg.

Larry Martin presented the Camp with a portable table top podium that he had hand crafted from reclaimed lumber that originally dated back prior to the War of Northern Aggression..

Chris Cutre gave us a first hand account of recent SCV flagging activities in Lexington, VA .

Discussion of old business commenced with the reading of the minutes for the January Meeting and the Camp's financial report.

Both were accepted as read..

Larry Martin then introduced a motion on the floor to authorize the procurement of a Bonny Blue Flag to replace the one that was lost a few months ago. The motion was seconded and passed.

Jerry Walden then addressed the membership on some of the "firsts" he had experienced since becoming the Caommander of Camp 586. These include d the first grave dedication, first repair of a veteran's headstone , Caparisoned horse detail and "talking tombstones" for public awareness.

Jerry also expressed how proud of the advances we have made as a Camp over the past few years and his gratitude for all the efforts of the rank and file that made these advances possible. As a result of

these, Jerry announced that there will be a Camp 586 picnic held later this year for Camp member, their spouses and family to celebrate our fellowship and accomplishments together.

Calvin Allen reported on the Camp's MCG appearances at the Ft. Worth Stock Show Parade, as well as riding in the Grand Entries of several of the rodeo performances .

New Camp business got under way with Ray Bell briefing us all on the upcoming Memorial Plaza Dedication Ceremony in Palestine, which is scheduled for April. 13th. Ray reminded us all that it is well known that several activist groups are planning to bring busloads of people to this event to protest and we must all be mindful of our responsibility to conduct ourselves as representatives of the Camp, the Texas Division and the SCV as a whole. Sound advice indeed. David Moore also added that the Texas Division is asking for maximum effort from all SCV members to support this event.

We are starting the new year in a strong fashion. We have a lot of activities and hopefully a spot where everyone feels comfortable. A couple of things to consider is the Peach Festival and

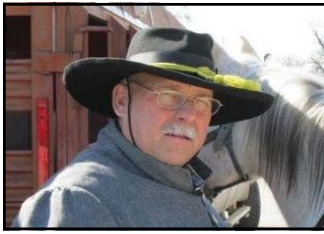

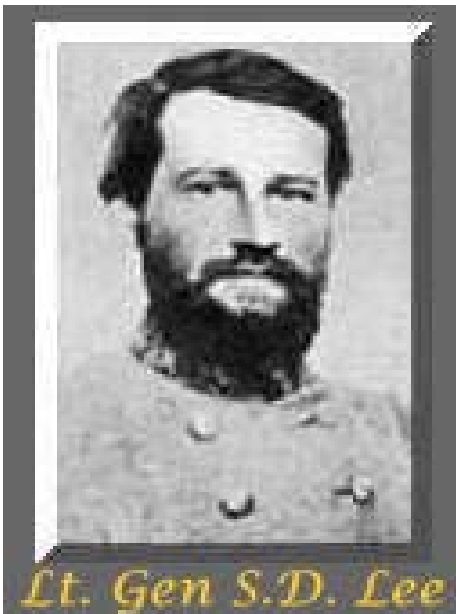

Beginning next month. I am going to add a space in the newsletter for individual members to post any announcements & messages they might want to add.

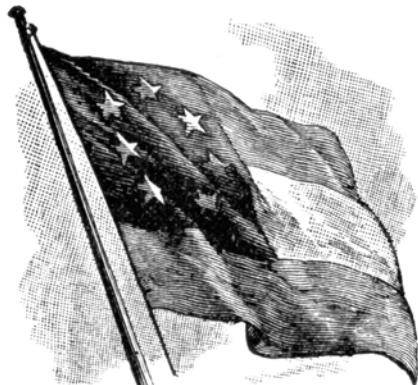
