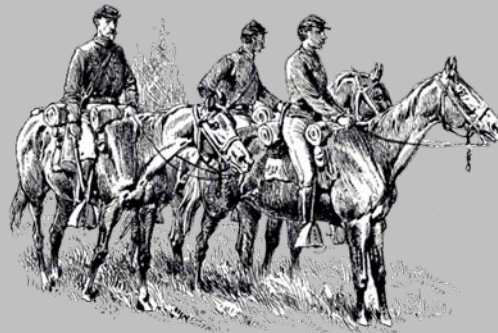

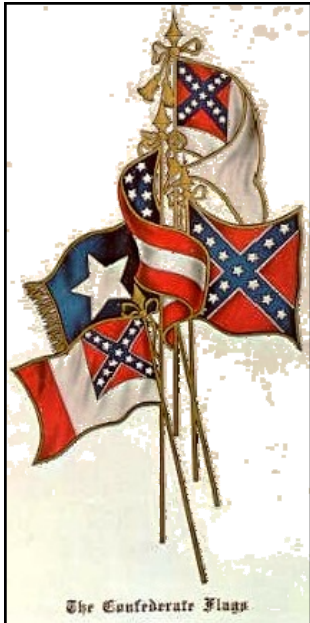

Also discussed were plans for the gravesite ceremony, which will include the Camp's Mounted Color Guard and a caparisoned (riderless) horse. Debbie Wilson will be attempting to contact the cemetery committee to gain the necessary approval for such a ceremony

Riders please contact either myself or LTCDR David Wilson for coordinating instructions.

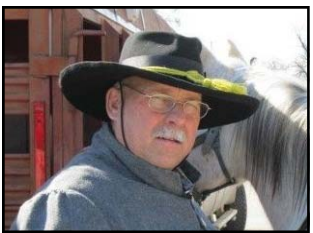
